

A FABULOUS GARDEN IN BRIDGEHAMPTON HAS JUST BECOME AVAILABLE FOR HAH MEMBERS TO TOUR!

The Reifer Garden was designed by Chinese artist Jian Guo Xu (pronounced: "shoe"). Using every tool that an artist can bring to bear, Xu has made the property his canvas. With a playwright's sense of drama and an artist's eye for detail he has transformed the undulating landscape of native Oak and Mountain Laurel into a paradisiacal retreat.

Many of the great gardens of China were created for the intelligentsia of the times who sought respite from a turbulent world. Likewise, the mission of this garden is to bring inspiration and therapy to all who enter.

The garden structures and stonework were built by Chinese craftsmen with imported materials, making this garden very rare outside of China. With thousands of varieties of plants from rare specimen trees to exotic tropicals, it is a plant-lover's paradise.

From the Tea Garden to the Three Bridges and the Music Pavilion to the Koi Pond there is something of interest for everyone.

Directions to 5 Paumonak Road, Bridgehampton: From either Montauk Highway or north of the highway back roads, go to Scuttlehole Road at either Water Mill from the west or at Bridgehampton. At the roundabout located at the intersection of Mitchell's Lane and Millstone Road, go north onto Millstone Road. Make a right turn onto Old Sag Harbor Road, then a left turn at Paumonak Road to #5.

This tour is free to HAH Members. Premium members may bring up to 2 guests at no charge. Non-premium members' guests pay \$10 each. Members must accompany their guests. Guests may join HAH at sign-in.
